Time Capsule - Year 1976

On March 31, 1976, Taft High School students had packed up some of their treasured memorabilia, sealed in plastic bags, into a picnic cooler. The cooler was buried, under a layer of tar, in the plaza near the Hurlbut Street front entrance, with instructions to dig up the time capsule at the beginning of the new century. That proved more of a challenge since its original marker stone was vandalized and removed years ago.

Dr. John Graven, principal during the 1976 Heritage Day celebration, returned to remember the delivery of the time capsule by a 1776 Revolutionary War honor guard, a U.S. Army helicopter landing on the front lawn, cutting of a Bicentennial birthday cake, and a ring of students, arm-in-arm around the entire building, while the capsule was buried.

"For those of us who were there on that day, the memory shall never be forgotten," he added. Graven remembered his nine years as Taft principal, from 1969 to 1978, as the golden years of his 38-year career as teacher, principal and central office administrator "because of the students' academic excellence, their school spirit, the parental involvement and commitment to the school and to the community, the dedicated and creative faculty, and the community at large who contributed positively to the welfare and success of Taft High School. This spirit continues today because of the efforts of the Alumni Association."

As three alumni from the class of 1977 opened the cooler and displayed the contents, they remarked how well the items survived the test of time. Included with many other items were a photograph of William Howard Taft, copies of play programs, A Taft Traveling Troupe performance shirt, a girls' gym suit and a Chicago Tribune newspaper. Contents from the time capsule will be placed in a display case at the school.

Newest Hall of Fame Honorees

A judge, a legislator, an author, an actor and an artist went back to Taft High School on May 26 to be honored in the Taft Alumni Hall of Fame.

"One is tempted to look backwards, at the great time we had here," said Judge **Wayne Andersen** (1963), who serves on the federal bench in the Northern District of Illinois. He remembered with special fondness English teacher Dan Lyons and social studies teacher Irv Stein and "what they taught me. People should be free to express ideas and we shouldn't be afraid of people being different." He paid tribute to the TAA and president Kay Kuciak for keeping the spirit of Taft alive.

He recently established an award to honor Taft students who achieve top scores on the required U.S. Constitution test.

Andersen went from Taft to Harvard University and the U. of IL College of Law, and a staff position with state Rep. Henry Hyde. He later served as deputy secretary of state under future Gov. Jim Edgar, specializing in traffic safety. He was elected to Cook County Circuit Court in 1984 and to the federal bench in 1991.

State Senator **Richard Klemm** (1950), R-32nd, recalled coming back to high school is not the same. "Sometimes you're disappointed. I see the growth of Taft, the impact. You can see the changes and enthusiasm of the young people."

He remembered when he first went to Springfield, he was one of five Taft graduates in the Illinois General Assembly. Also there were state Rep. **Ralph Capparelli** and state Rep. **Lynn Martin** (both inducted to the Alumni Hall of Fame in 1989), **Loleta Didrickson** (later state comptroller) and state Sen. **James DeLeo**. Sometimes he said, the relationship and trust they had as alumni served them well in overcoming political partisanship to pass worthy bills.

Klemme earned his engineering degree from Purdue U. and is a Korean War veteran. He heads the family business, Food Warming Equipment Co. He held positions in township government, was president of the District 46 Board of Education and chairman of the McHenry County Board before running for the general assembly in 1980. After terms in the Illinois House of Representatives, he ran successfully for the senate seat.

"As we grow older there is a tendency to look to the past, and the teachers who simply made us think," said **Richard Lindberg** (1971). "I came from a family of modest means. My grades were in a comfortable range. I had a vague notion of wanting to be a professional writer." He was pushed beyond complacency by some determined faculty members, and "the honor would not have been possible" without them, Lindberg added, citing English teacher **Alice Jerusal**, social studies teachers **Nick Mitchell** and **Gerald Cuny**, and music teacher **Mila Nolan**. Nolan and Cuny, Lyons and Stein were among the audience members.

Lindberg's interest in sports in general and the Chicago White Sox in particular prompted him to write six books on the Sox, including "Who's On Third?", "The Chicago White Sox Story" in 1983 and "Stealing First in a Two-Team Town" in 1994. He was named official historian for the team in 1985. Other books have focused on Chicago's ethnic diversity and its infamous history, including "Chicago Ragtime," "To Serve and Collect..." a history of the Chicago Police, and his latest, "Return to the Scene of the Crime: A Guide to Infamous Places in Chicago."

Dr. **Robert Forney** (1944) sent classmate Ed Ferguson to accept his award. Forney, a retired chemical engineer who spent his career of nearly 40 years with DuPont, was traveling in Syria. He remembered being at Taft as the U.S. entered WWII, facing the impact of D-Day just before graduation and seeing friends go off into service, to be injured or killed in action. When Taft formed its Army ROTC unit, Ferguson and Forney were among those who joined.

"How grateful I am to be a graduate of Taft High School, said **George Zima** (1945). I feel privileged. I'm very humbled." In context of the Memorial Day weekend, he remembered several classmates who lost their lives in WWII. "None of us would be here without their sacrifice."

Zima and his sister had worked as a dance team, performing at the USO and around the Chicago area. After Taft, where he was a cheerleader and band member, he studied to be a teacher. Mid-career he headed to Broadway, where he worked in famous productions from "Pal Joey" and "Gypsy" to "Most Happy Fella" His TV career included Mary Martin's "Peter Pan," "Captain Kangaroo," appearances on many variety shows and some dramatic work. He returned to teaching, retiring as an elementary school principal, and now teaches dance for the Wheaton Park District.

Nancy Noble Zorick (1964) also paid tribute to teacher Dan Lyons, for helping her take a drama class during high school. After Taft she had started a career as a commercial artist but parts in Chicago

area theater led her to a brief film career in CA. After meeting her future husband, Mike, who competed as a runner and wrestler despite a sight disability, she switched her career back to art and has won awards for her work. The couple visit schools as inspirational speakers, discussing their life experiences.

The final inductee was **Kay Carlson Kuciak** (January 1963). She received the most nominations for the hall of fame of any candidate over the years.

She answered a call for help from Taft's principal **Sam Ozaki** in 1983 to help organize the alumni association and has been its president ever since. They started with a list of 100 names. She and her husband **Tom Kuciak** (June 1962) have worked as a team, with Tom handling data input for a mailing list, which has grown to more than 16,000 names.

Since Tom's retirement as a customer services manager for Sprint/Centel, the couple is relocating from Des Plaines to Arizona. They appear together in the photo on the Hall of Fame wall.

Not So Fond Memories... continued

I want to thank **Claire McCormack Bernett** (1986) for writing so insightfully and honestly about "peer abuse." In today's media saturation, it often seems as if this behavior is viewed as a recent phenomenon of the 80's and 90's. But ask anyone my age (50) if they enjoyed high school and – unless they were part of the elite cheerleading/football crowd – almost all will answer with a resounding "No!" Not surprisingly, most will also reveal memories of the private hells they endured from various forms of peer abuse.

Those of us from the Class of '68 cannot possibly forget one of the most brutal examples of peer abuse that occurred throughout our four years of high school: the ruthless taunting and cruel antagonism toward one of our classmates who was truly not like any of us. She was known as "Crazy Chris."

Chris was unattractive, lived with her grandparents (no one seemed to know where her parents were), had a tormented physical demeanor and often mumbled incoherently to herself. When taunted – usually by the popular football honchos who dictated the Who's Who list in Taft's social strata – she could be provoked to loud and angry outbursts, spoken in a language that only Chris understood.

But Chris was also a talented artist, focusing her creative energy on intricate drawings of her beloved deep-sea divers. She was obsessed with these characters -- they lived in their own world under the sea, far away from the cruelty of life above ground. As I remember them, her drawings depicted divers making phenomenal discoveries of treasures buried deep below the surface, accomplishing great feats of personal endurance.

Chris herself must have had to dig deep to endure the tortured life of a misfit in the bland, white, orderly world of Taft in the 60's. I do not remember any teachers or administrators stepping in to stop the abuse. The silence sent a message though: it was tacit approval of the behavior of Chris' tormenters. After all, they were "normal."

And what about the rest of us? Though many of us never uttered a cruel word toward Chris, neither did we jump to her defense. To my knowledge, none of us demanded intervention by Taft's administration. I do remember **Peggy Sullivan** – bless her good heart – trying to bring Chris into the fold of normality by having her brother take her to a prom. I hope the experience was a happy one for Chris.

When I think of Chris, I wonder if she has survived and thrived. Hopefully, her undeniable artistic strength and talent have helped her to endure. But most of all, I hope the voices of her tormenters no longer echo through her mind, as they did through the hallways of Taft for four relentless years.

There were many of us who did not follow the "Cheerleading/football crowd" who have **good** memories of our years at Taft. Just read the letters from alumni who write each issue. We joined band, drama club, chorus, school newspaper, debate club, French club, Student Council, GAA, teacher helpers, ROTC, and on and on. Or we did activities at the local parks, worked part-time jobs, volunteered as Candy Stripers at Resurrection Hospital, attended MYF, YMCA or other local organizations outside the school. Teen-age years can be tormenting. Not because of other's actions, but due to our own lack of confidence. It is part of the growing experience. Some felt it harder, perhaps than others, but all of us were exposed to it.*

As for the young lady you described, I believe I met her around 1985 at a Rachel Carson Society meeting I attended a few times. It involved local SCUBA divers in an ecological project at Navy Pier and she came in and also volunteered. She desperately wanted to dive with us, but all were leery of accepting her offer, as a diving "buddy" is someone for whom one's life depends on. As a stranger, who acted perhaps quite "differently" she was treated politely, but not really accepted. She had {at that time} just finished completing a diving course in Texas to become certified as a "Professional

SCUBA diver", but it did not help her fit better into society. We found an assignment within the project that she could do that was not involved with diving. Chris was her own person and appeared to learn to live with life as it was dealt to her. I do not know if she is a member of the Taft Alumni Association, but if so, we are glad she is and hope she enjoys being a part of something we are proud of.

It is unfortunate that some students have [had] the immaturity to taunt others. I see programs in my grandchildren's schools today trying to undo that wrong by teaching tolerance of others different than ourselves, whether physical or mental. They are learning through school what parents have neglected to teach at home. I applaud their efforts and see positive results in the newest generation to be exposed to better ways to deal with peer pressures and abuses. Let us do our part in a positive action by example - in treating **all** people as we would wish for ourselves. Note the following letter. J. Bloom, Editor]

Dear Editor: The last two issues of the newsletter contained articles telling of very unhappy experiences at Taft. Very sad! However, we must remember that social interaction is a two-way experience with responsibilities on both sides.

Before I joined the alumni association a friend of mine sent me copies of several past editions of the newsletter. In one of them reference was made to a prior issue that had featured the late **Ral Donner**, Taft's own version of Elvis Presley. At the time I was disappointed that I had not been able to contribute a few of my own memories of Ral to that article. However, when I recently came across the enclosed photograph of him, I decided to send it along to you in hopes that you might want to share with your readers.

It was taken in the summer of 1954 in the backyard of my parent's home at 6665 W. Raven St. (Ral is the batter on the right and my late brother **Rick [Terry]** is the one on the left. They were teammates on my father's little league team that summer at Norwood Park.)

In addition to being coached by my Dad, "Ralphie," as he was known to us back in the mid 1950s, was a frequent visitor to the Terry's residence. In fact for a couple of years there it almost seemed as if he had become somewhat of a second younger brother to me. Probably my fondest memories of Ral center around hot-summer afternoons on our screened in back porch, where he and I would often sit for hours playing my All-star baseball game. In don't believe that he played any real baseball after the little league, but by then, as I recall, he had already begun to sing regularly at the Baptist church. While I heard him perform there and knew early on that he had a wonderful voice, what I remember most about him from those days is what a great kid he was and what a good friend he was to my family. I didn't see much of Ral in the years right after this photo was taken and I never saw him again after I graduated from Taft and left Chicago. Nevertheless, my 91-year-old mother and I both remember him fondly and continue to be saddened by his tragically premature death.
