## Alumni Scholarships

Four scholarships were presented to deserving Taft graduates this year. Two \$500 awards and two \$1000 awards were given out, thanks to the generosity of former Taft students.

**Arlyn Dianne Larin Griego** was a Beat 1680 Club volunteer, a member of the Academic Decathlon, Math Club and National Honor Society. She hasn't completely narrowed down her vocational choice yet, but is leaning towards a medical or business field. As of press time, she had not chosen which of the four universities she has been accepted to. She was awarded a \$500 TAA scholarship.

**John Tsarouchas** earned the other \$500 TAA scholarship. Northwestern University has the honor of being chosen by John to help him with his goal of becoming a magazine/newspaper reporter or editor. With his excellent scholastic aptitude and strong physical presence, he earned the school's "most likely to succeed" and "most school spirit" recognitions by his peers. He was President of the National Honor Society, Captain of Varsity Football and Editor of the Taft Today newspaper and still maintained a 4.55 grade point average overall.

The **Robert "Bill" Hendricksen** Scholarship Award was begun last year by his wife, **Darlene Bruemmer** (June 1962). She has committed to funding a \$1,000 scholarship each year in his name. Bill was a member of the June 1960 class and passed away in 1991. Darlene encourages other alumni to do the same for loved ones they have lost.

This year's recipient of the Hendricksen scholarship is **Gabriela Escobar**. Five Universities want Gabriela to come to their school this fall. University of Illinois - Chicago will be her goal this fall to start towards her dream of being a children's psychologist. Although she worked after school for four years, she enjoyed being part of the Poetry Club and maintained a 3.03 grade point average overall.

A second special Alumni scholarship award was created in honor of **Penny Rhodes Ek**. Her classmates and husband, **Ron Ek**, established the Penny Rhodes Ek Memorial Scholarship as a onetime award in Penny's honor. She was a member of the June, 1960 class and passed away in February 2002. Penny, Ron and their three sons are all Taft alumni. They are very proud Taftites and Penny was an incredible person.

The recipient of the Penny Rhodes Ek Memorial Scholarship is **Jessica Bernal**. As a very active student at Taft, she excelled at both sport and academic interests. She earned the honor of being Varsity captain of the girls' swimming team (member for 4 years) and also was on the Taft girls' soccer team for the last two years and coached the boys' Varsity soccer team for 4 years. Last fall she earned the first "student of the month" award from her efforts of directing a massive fund-raiser to help victims of 9/11. I enjoyed seeing the picture of the Norwood Park Drum and Bugle Corps from 1932. [See Spring 2002 issue] I belonged to the Corps but a little later. It was during World War II. At Douglas Field (which is now O'Hare) the B-17 bomber was built. The citizens of Norwood Park got together and decided to have a B-17 hospital plane built. At the corner of Raven Street and Northwest Highway, on the side of a four story building a painting was done of the airship with the title "SPIRIT OF NORWOOD".

Shoes were rationed during the war and I needed a pair. My mother went to the ration board and they gave her a coupon for a pair because of my war effort in being part of Norwood Park Drum and Bugle Corps.

We played at many bond rallies and other functions until finally enough war bonds were sold to pay for the aircraft. When finished a dedication ceremony was held at the war plant. A prayer for the plane was said by a Rabbi, a Priest and a Minister. As part of the ceremony we got to play. It was an event in my life I will never forget.

We enjoy the newsletter very much and just received my info on our 50<sup>th</sup> Reunion next year – Jan '53. Always like the various articles written by fellow Tafties on their comings and goings.

This past Feb. 2002 my wife and I worked as volunteers at the Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, UT. My job was located at Snow Basin Resort (45 miles north of SLC) site of the Men's/Ladies Downhill, Combined and Super G Ski Races. We had 1500 volunteers working on the two racecourses doing all the grooming and preparation by hand, i.e., shoveling snow, raking and stomping the snow etc... for 12 straight days – Feb. 4<sup>th</sup> 'til Feb. 16<sup>th</sup>. The day started at 0330 wake-up, then a one hour drive to the parking lot to arrive by 0500 and on the mountain by 0600 (before dawn) to start our daily grooming. At 1000 the event(s) would start, so we had to have our various things done by then and become spectators until the event was over, about 1300. Some days we had to go back out and work until 4 or 5 in the evening, other days we could ski the rest of the afternoon for free. I also worked at Snow Basin during

the Paralympics, which followed the Olympics by about 10 days. These events lasted for another 12 days. All in all I worked 24 days at Snow Basin grooming the race course(s).

My wife's job was in event services at Park City and Deer Valley but she only worked the Olympics and not the Paralympics.

We both had a great time working these Winter Games, along with a total of 26,000 other volunteers, even though the work was hard and the hours were long. We both received a complete Olympic uniform, an Olympic watch, tickets to the Opening Ceremonies (Dress Rehearsal) and Opening Ceremonies for the Paralympics, tickets to the Medal's Plaza and a post-



Olympic thank you party. We also were able to attend various events we had bought tickets for (son Jay joined us from Chicago) along with free events in the city. Truly a great experience for both of us, we would volunteer again in a heartbeat.

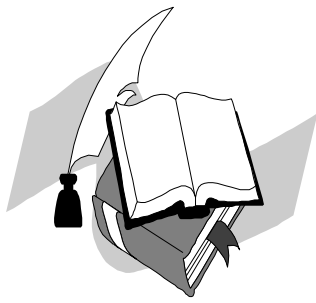

## Why Pay Dues?

## Do You Remember?

We went to school each day by bus. You could obtain a buss pass from your homeroom teacher each semester that would allow you to take the bus for ten cents a ride. Parking a car was for faculty only and if you were lucky enough to drive a car, you had to register it with Mr. Miller and part it on the street.

Twice a month on a Friday night, there was a dance held in the gym. There were dance instructions from 7:30 to 8:30 and General Dancing was from 8:30 to 11:45 p.m. The cost was \$.50. Girls were to wear ordinary street dresses, no slacks or jeans. The boys were to wear suit coats and ties. If you were to go to the "show", you would go to the Times Theater or the Gateway Theater in Jefferson Park or the Pickwick Theater in Park Ridge. There was an Outdoor Theater at Harlem and Irving. The Hub Roller Rink was a popular place to go as well as Riverview, where if you went on certain days, the rides were only five cents.

Pizza was very popular then as it is now. Favorites were Orsi's in Edison Park, Canale's on Higgins Road near Harlem, El Centro at Elston and Central and Brigante's Salad Bowl on Harlem at Belmont. If you wanted a hot dog or hamburger, our Arnold's was Super Dawg at Nagle and Milwaukee, which is still there.

We listened to music by Elvis Presley, Pat Boone, Kingston Trio, the Four Lads, Four Aces, etc. and we heard it on the Howard Miller radio show. The clothing that the girls wore were felt shirts, white bucks, saddle shoes, peter pan collared blouses with a little bunch of flowers pinned at the neck. We had scarves tied to our pony tails. The guys would have crew cuts, or DA's, draped pants, box-toes shoes, pink shirts with T.C. collars and skinny ties. They also wore white bucks and, if they were not going with a particular girl, they wore their letterman's sweater or she may be wearing it.

You took an active part during high school by being a part of sports, cheerleading or R.O.T.C., French, German or Spanish clubs, drama, chorus, orchestra and band, chess science or inventors clubs, or worked on the Taft Trib, at the Box Office, the Aerie (yearbook) or be a teacher's helper. Several worked as hall guards or in the lunchroom.
