New Address for Taft Possible

Since the main entrance is now located on the south side of the building on Bryn Mawr, Taft Principal Dr. Tarvardian is campaigning to change the official school address from its present one at 6545 W. Hurlbut. The Hurlbut address became the official address for the school after the completion of the 1970s addition and moving of the school offices off the Hurlbut side of the school.

With the confusion of the Hurlbut address, people looking to access the building wind up on the wrong side. Also a consideration, extra guards are now needed to cover both the Hurlbut side and the Bryn Mawr doors.

The new main entrance was created last year on Bryn Mawr to allow for efficient traffic flow, allowing CTA busses to access the circular driveway in front of the new entrance. School officials stated there needs to be coordination with the Chicago Fire Department and US Postal Service before it can be changed. He suggested using 6530 W. Bryn Mawr Avenue. We'll keep you posted on any future decisions on this potential change.

Frank Zemaitis A VIP who Enjoys Children and Writing

Frank Zemaitis tells the story of a young girl who came to Chellberg Farm for a visit and left with his heart. The girl, said Zemaitis, called him "grand- pa" and wanted to take him home with her because who didn't have her own grandfather. "I love children," said the father of two, grandfather to one and step great-grandfather to two.

That's one of the rewards of volunteering, said Zemaitis, who, with his wife Jane, moved to Porter in 1990 from Chicago. They'd visited the dunes for decades, but primarily visited the Indiana Dunes State Park. Then they went to their first Duneland Harvest Festival and Zemaitis said he saw "a gentleman my age" helping direct traffic. That, he said, was something he could do.

Zemaitis began working both the fall festival and the spring's Maple Sugar Festival. He became a member of the Friends of Indiana Dunes, Inc., serving on its board for three years and most recently receiving the group's Founder's Award.

Much of his early years volunteering were spent giving tours of the Chellberg Farm barn area to school groups; telling them the history of the barn and all about the animals from the chickens to pigs to horses. Most recently, though, Zemaitis has been a regular contributor to the Singing Sands Almanac, researching and writing articles pertaining to history or nature. He's the author of the continuing Talking Tree series of stories.

It is a passion that dates back to his days in high school before operating his own camera repair business in Chicago. "I wrote a column for our high school paper," he said. He also took courses in creative writing.

At age 75 and at the encouragement of his children, he obtained a computer and began using the Internet for research. Now, at age 80, Zemaitis has completed a children's book "Tasos and the Arms of Venus" and most recently had an article of the history of the Chellberg family published in the summer 2002 edition of Traces of Indiana and Midwestern History.

"I always felt that one should give back to the community if you can. I never had the opportunity when I lived in Chicago," he said about why he volunteers. "We are basically people people."

Elevator Dilemma

To bring the Taft into compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act, some modification to the current elevator is needed. Budget belt-tightening at the Chicago Public School headquarters discourages the school from installing a more accessible elevator than what is currently used. What is proposed would change the current elevator location (freight elevator at end of narrow hallway behind the auditorium) to something in a more accessible area of the school. Dr. Tarvardian, Taft's principal says it is a big safety issue. The narrow hallway to the current elevator is too small to allow a wheelchair to turn around, if necessary. Also, the access from the main corridor has turns that constrict good visibility. If someone is in trouble near the elevator, he or she could not be seen. In addition, the elevator door modification necessary to comply with the ADA requirements might not open wide enough to serve the elevator's original purpose. The Local School Council is working with Dr. Tarvardian to come up with an acceptable solution.

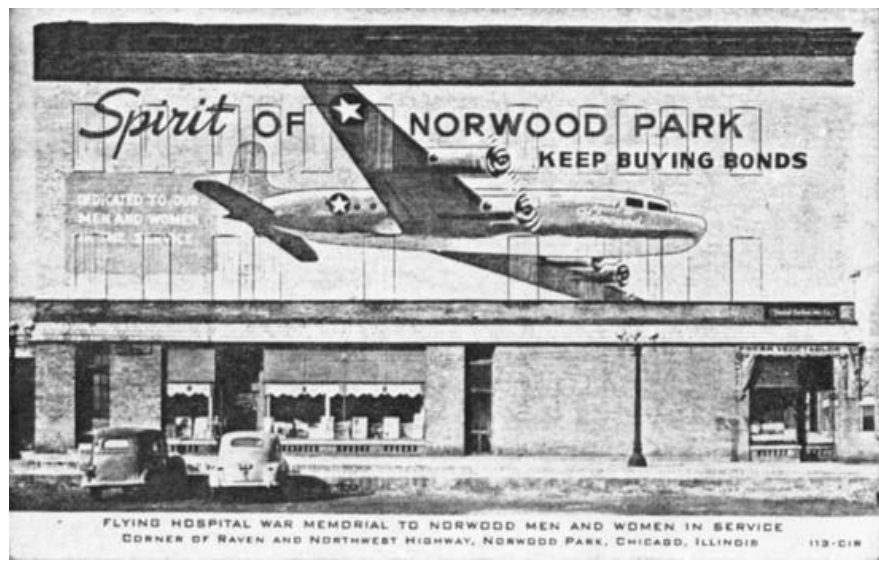
Subject: Spirit of Norwood

Jackie [Jacqueline] Montville (1963) of DeKalb sent me a copy of the newsletter. Although after graduating from St. Thecla, I did not attend Taft, I delight in reading about Norwood and looking for names of people from Norwood. The playgrounds at St. Thecla, Onahan, and Norwood and Rosedale Parks were so familiar to me.

I was in the B Corps of the Drum and Bugle Corps. The recent articles and photos brought back memories of those Saturdays at the Norwood Field House when we would have to shape up and listen to directions. **Don Rowe** (1955) taught bugle. Mrs. Grana tailored our uniforms.

In the fall of 1956, a few Taft alums started a football team at Rosedale Park. They had in mind helping to pick up the Taft football program. The boys I remember on the team were **Roger Gorkas, Eric Miller (1961), Bob Young (1961), Jim Grabowski (1962), Tom Isaacson (1961) and Rick Terry (1962)**. I

believe most of these fellows four years later were on the championship Taft football team. As I remember, Grabowski scrimmaged for a while in street pants, i.e., without knee, thigh and hip pads. All-star **Al MacFarland** (1961) played on the Edison Park team.

Here is a story not unlike other stories during WWII. My family lived on Nassau Av across from **Kenneth Reinert** (1944) (next door to young **Jack Grabowski** – 1951). Immediately after the graduation celebrations, Ken went through the swift basic training as a soldier and shipped out to the Philippines as a replacement. Within 7 months of graduation, his mother Lillian Reinert was devastated to receive the news: KIA, Philippines.

Remembering Our Teachers...

Another teacher, similar to **Dr. Buchwalter**, was **Miss Ella Luedemann**, who taught French, Latin, Algebra, and, perhaps, Geometry.

You were never late to her class, if at all possible. The bell rang and she began teaching and, heaven help you, if you didn't have your homework, and have it done completely and correctly. Although stern and uncompromising, she had a good sense of humor. She gave freely of her time to her students, if you asked her anything. She was always smartly dressed and looked very professional.

I took two years of Latin from Miss Luedemann and two and a half years of French. Thanks to her, when I began college, I was placed in third year French classes. In her class we often counted rapidly through the class in French and then played "Buzz." When someone couldn't quickly remember and say, in French, multiples of seven or number with seven in them, I can recall her smiling with a little laugh and saying, "You're out!"

Although I enjoyed her language classes, I knew when to quit while I was ahead. I never took math from Miss Luedemann.
